

24-hour supervision and care

Nursing and medical care

Habilitative services, such as speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy
*
Educational and vocational training
*
Social and recreational activities
Who Is Eligible for ICF/DD Services?
To be eligible for ICF/DD services, an individual must:
*
Have a developmental disability
*
Be at least three years old
*
 Need 24-hour supervision and care

*

Be unable to live independently in the community

How to Apply for ICF/DD Services

To apply for ICF/DD services, you must contact your local Medicaid office. The Medicaid office will assess your need for services and determine if you are eligible.

What to Expect from an ICF/DD Program

If you are approved for ICF/DD services, you will be placed in a program that is appropriate for your needs. ICF/DD programs vary in size and setting, but all programs must meet certain standards of care.

These standards include:

Providing a safe and homelike environment

*

• Offering a variety of services to meet the needs of individuals

*

 Having qualified staff who are trained to provide care to individuals with developmental disabilities

*

• Ensuring that individuals have opportunities to participate in community activities

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
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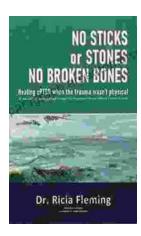
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
