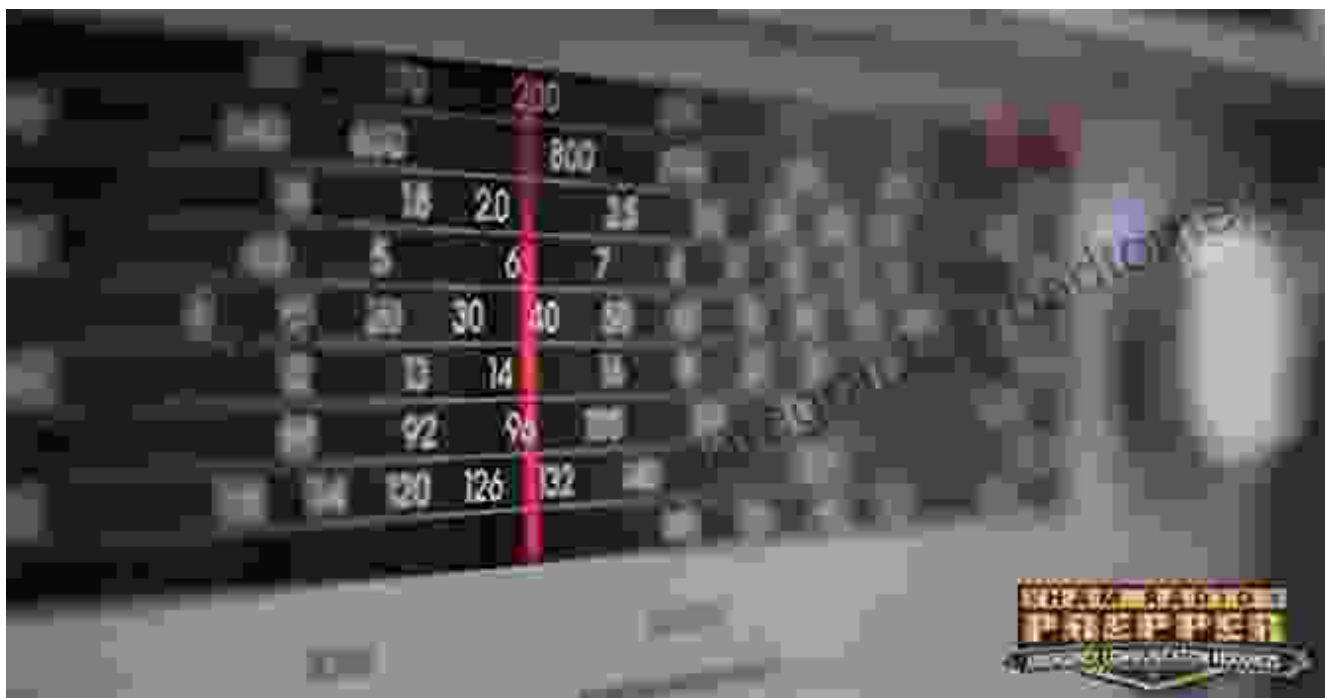


A vintage shortwave receiver from the golden age of broadcasting

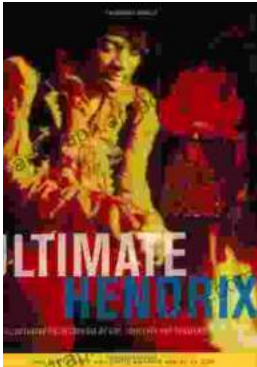


Preserving the Legacy of Shortwave Broadcasting

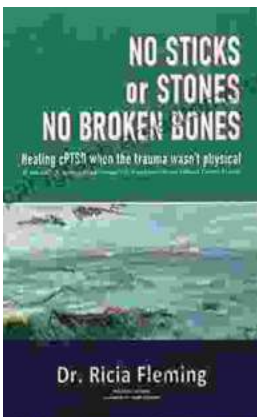
